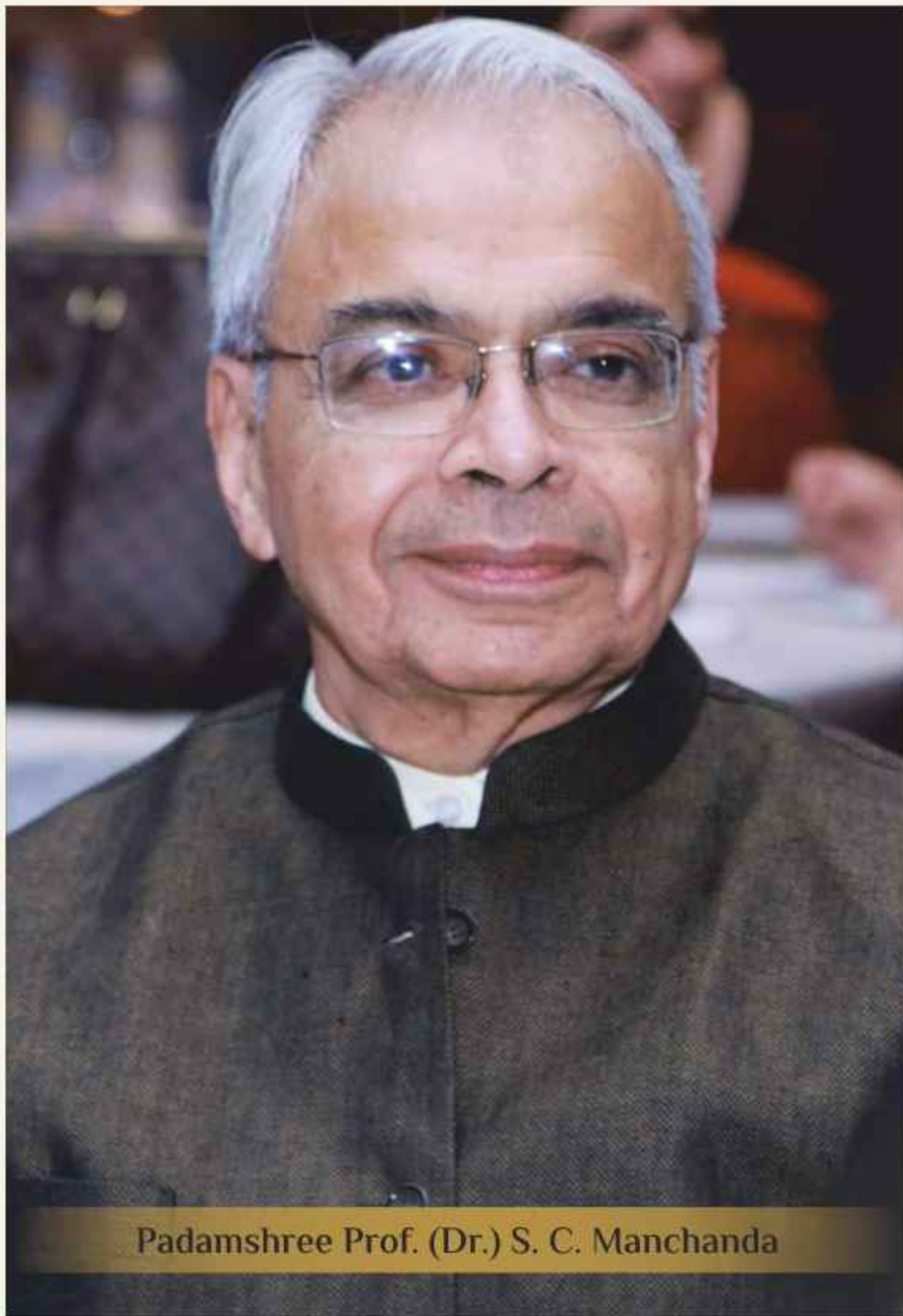
Vision

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Two Iraqi children get new lease of life

Two critically ill Iraqi children got new lease of life by doctors in Delhi. The children were brought to Capital with the help of NGOs.

Both the girls, two-year-old Staink Azad Khalil and seven-year-old Navreen Yasom, were critical and were suffering from advanced stage of cardiac disease. Their treating doctors claimed that due to lack of medical facilities in war-torn area of Iraq, these children would not have survived long without medical attention.

About a fortnight ago, doc-

tors of Sir Ganga Ram Hospital (SGRH) were contacted by two NGOs working in war-torn area of Iraq, the capability of Iraqi Kurdistan.

These NGOs, "Bring Hope Humanitarian Foundation" and "Dhya India Foundation in India, were trying to help two critically ill children who were living in desperate conditions in an internally displaced person's camp in Iraq. The project is aligned with permission from Ministry of Health in Iraq.

"Children were evaluated at SGHR and Staink was found to have a seriously malform-

ed heart condition where half of her heart was missing congenitally. Also, which there was shortage of oxygen in her body. She was frequently turning blue and had a heart time hematuria episode," said Dr. Hageendra, Chairman, Pediatric Cardiac Sciences, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital.

Dr. Joshi further said, "After echocardiography & cardiac catheterisation studies, it was ensured that a surgical option could be offered. On 22 July 2019, our team performed the first stage of complex repair of heart. After the surgery Staink now has safe levels of oxygen in her body and is doing well."

ing. She will come back for second and last stage of surgery after four years. She has been discharged from the hospital on 30 July 2019 and is ready to fly back to Iraq to celebrate the holy festival of Eid with rest of her family.

Navreen was found to have a medically manageable problem and once the surgery was successfully established, she also is deemed fit to fly back. Great Mothers of Study, Nazam Iqbal Mawhood expressed her heartfelt gratitude on successful treatment in India. "My heart is full of praise for warm hospitality given by Indian people at the hospital," said Fatima.

GIFT OF LIFE

Two Iraqi girls were brought to Delhi after being diagnosed with an advanced stage of cardiac disease in Erbil. Due to lack of medical facilities in Erbil, their parents were losing hope with every passing day to see their child condition getting worse. Both the girls, two years old Staish Azad Khalil and seven-year-old Naveen, were living in extreme conditions in an internally displaced person's camp in Iraq before coming to Delhi and would not have survived long without medical attention. Fortunately, "Diya Global", a part of Diya India in collaboration with "Bring Hope Humanitarian Foundation" contacted Sir Ganga Ram Hospital in Delhi where their condition was evaluated. Staish underwent successful surgery and was deemed to fly back whereas Naveen was found to have a medically manageable problem and once therapy was successfully established, she too was permitted to fly back home. The parents with all their emotions have expressed high gratitude to Diya India Foundation and Bring Hope Foundation for saving the lives of their children.

- › Today, girls do not have consistent access to sanitary pads. In India, almost 88% of women use homemade alternatives, such as an old cloth, rags, hay, sand or ash which are unhygienic and causes a lot of health problems to them.
- › Due to lack of awareness, there are a lot of taboos associated with menstruation because of which women consider them impure and observe various religious and social restrictions. So to overcome such social challenges, hence #ProudtoBleed!!

It isn't easy for parents to anticipate in hope that someday their child would hear them. With the "You support, We connect" campaign, Diya India Foundation has taken the initiative to help underprivileged children who are suffering from partial or complete hearing loss by providing them with hearing aids and hearing implants at Asha Speech and Hearing Clinic in Delhi.

In India, 63 million people (6.3%) suffer from the significant auditory loss. Four in every 1000 children suffer from severe to profound hearing loss. With over 100,000 babies that are born with hearing deficiency every year.

A person suffering from hearing impairment has difficulty in perceiving or identifying sound clearly due to auditory problems. The impairment may be unilateral or bilateral.

It was observed that in case of hearing-impaired children, by the time parents fully understood the nature of the problem and took steps to overcome it, it became too late for a child to acquire language and speech. A child who is denied timely help gets into his/her own shell and gets totally cut off from society.

If a child who is suffering from such condition is given aid under the age of 5 years, the chance for him or her to learn to speak and understand is better than if the procedure is done at a later age.
